
### 37) Is there a need for transportation services for senior residents of Alstead to and from any of the area communities?






#### 39) Should the Town target particular parts of the community for commercial and/or industrial growth?


### 39a) What part of town should be targeted for commercial and/or industrial growth?


### 40) Should the Town actively promote the Village as a location for new businesses?


### 41) Do you support the Town of Alstead building a new town hall or community center?


### 42) What is your single greatest hope or wish for Alstead in the next 10 years?


#### 43) What is the single greatest threat to Alstead in the next 10 years?
