# Presentation by Jeff McIver & Michael Cannon of Consolidated Communications Incorported – Town Fiber Builds

- 23 state fiber network spanning 44,000 fiber-route miles, 1.8 million connections. Nasdaq: CNSL. CCI serves most of New Hampshire.
- CCI delivers 99.999% core network availability. Main Network Operations center is in Manchester, N.H. CCI has local garages in Keene, Claremont, etc. 16 separate work out locations in N.H. with CCI employees. Approx. 680 CCI employees, approx. 63 contractor employees.
- CCI has fiber optic buildouts in progress or completed in the towns of Chesterfield, Walpole, Dublin, Harrisville, Westmoreland, and Rindge.
- CCI's major focus is now on the consumer side.
- Customers can use their own equipment, rent equipment or buy equipment.
- CCI claims 1,225 total end user locations in Alstead. 14 serving units (hubs). 40% of current existing subscribers are at max. speed (the max. speed the customers qualify for).
- CCI will try to create a solution even if the percentage of underserved residents is low.
- The bottleneck for these projects is not the fiber build out. It is the bonding process. CCI will start the build out shortly after the bond is approved.
- Almost all services from pole to house are installed at no cost to the resident regardless of distance (150ft rule is generally not enforced). Services can be installed in existing customer owned underground conduit.
